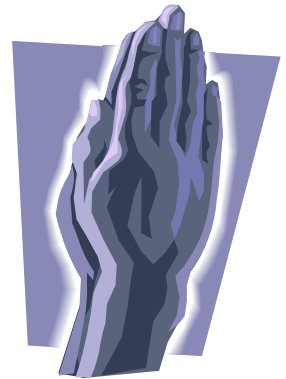

Chaplin's Letter

Greetings Brother Knights,

Over the past several years, the Knights of Columbus have repaired and cleaned the gutters at my rectory several times, assisted with general lawn and garden maintenance several times, power washed and painted the porch, and most recently, added a side entrance to our garage. Time and again, the Knights have been so helpful in making Ascension's rectory a better place for me to live. I am so appreciative of the support the Knights have been so willing to provide me.

As nice and as helpful as all of this work has been, it is nothing compared to the first time I invited the Knights to liturgy at Ascension after I had been installed as pastor. In the midst of a debilitating and deeply embarrassing clergy sexual abuse scandal, every one of the Knights who came to our church wore a button saying "In Solidarity With Our Priests." Just the sight of those buttons has been one of the most healing and significant moments of my seven years of priestly ministry. I keep one of those but-

tons on my nightstand next to my rosary and breviary. There isn't a day that goes by that I do not see that button and am reminded of the support of my brother Knights.

When I left the Department of Justice in 1994 for the seminary, my fellow office workers bought me a deluxe four volume set of the Liturgy of the Hours. I have prayed with this set of prayer books for twelve years now. Since I use them at least three times each day, there is a connection there that even time cannot erode. The same is true of simple metal button declaring the solidarity of the Knights with their priests. I am certain I am not the only priest who treasures this simple yet powerful symbol of the love, support of the Knights. I look forward to serving you as Chaplain.
