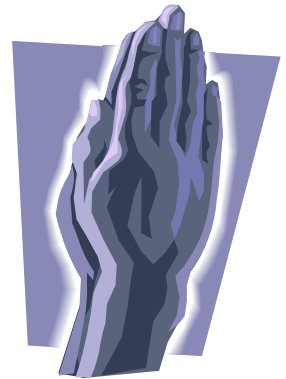

## Chaplain's Letter

Greetings Brother Knights,

In the Gospel for the 24th week of Ordinary Time (October 23-24) the disciples engage in a pointless debate about which among them is the greatest. Jesus admonishes them for this discussion and reminds them that the greatest must lay down their lives, pick up their cross and be the servant of all. Naturally, they (and most, if not all, of us) find this advice to be extremely difficult.

Instead of asking which among us is the greatest, what if we ask how can we become excellent disciples? Many of us who are successful in our careers already have somewhat of an understanding of what it takes to be in excellent in our fields. Years of study, years of experience, hard work, and yes, assistance in the form of grace (and much nicer way of saying the word "luck.") Excellence in athletics is similarly a mixture of all of these: study, experience, practice, hard work, and grace. No one would suggest that we could achieve excellence in anything with just one hour of practice each week.

Jesus called his disciples to become excellent disciples. He did not promise that their conversion would happen overnight (and it didn't) or that it could be achieved in as little as one hour a week (and it can't.) He did promise that the work of discipleship is God's holy work and that it would reap divine rewards.

As Knights we are constantly reminded of the virtues of service to country and Church, the value of hard work, the joy of community and fellowship, and the discipline of prayer and worship. God gives us many opportunities each day to work on excellence in Christian discipleship. I hope you will see in your holy calling as a brother Knight an opportunity to continue the holy pursuit of excellence in following Jesus Christ.
